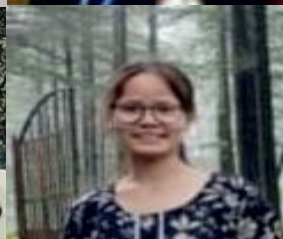
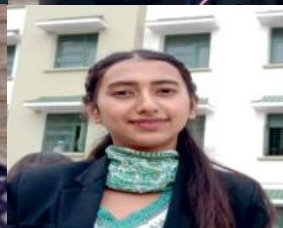

Historical Background

The institution stands on a site steeped in history. The building, dating back to the 1850s, was originally known as the Elysium Lodge and served multiple purposes over time.

It later came into the possession of Raja Padam Chandra of Jubbal, a noted philanthropist, who dedicated it to the cause of higher education.

A degree college was established here in 1945, and in 1957, it was reorganized as Rana Padam Chandra Sanatan Dharam Bhargava College. The college was taken over by the Government of Himachal Pradesh in 1977 and was transformed into an exclusive girls' college in 1978, acquiring its present name.

Since then, the institution has steadily evolved into a premier centre of learning.

Academic and Institutional Profile

Initially offering programmes in Humanities and Sciences, the college soon expanded to include Commerce and a variety of professional and self-financing courses, such as BCA, Biotechnology, Microbiology, Journalism and Mass Communication, Travel and Tourism, and Fine Arts.

In 2024, postgraduate programmes in Commerce, English, History, and Political Science were introduced, marking a significant academic milestone.

The college also runs Sandhya Sangeet Mahavidyalaya, affiliated with Bhatkhande Sangeet Vidyapeeth, Lucknow, offering training and degree courses in classical music and dance.

Infrastructure and Student Development

RKMV provides a well-developed campus with modern classrooms, laboratories, computer and language labs, a computerized library, auditorium, gymnasium, canteen, and hostel facilities.

Students are encouraged to participate in co-curricular and extension activities such as NSS, NCC, Bharat Scouts and Guides, Eco Club, Red Cross, and Rotaract Club, which help in nurturing leadership, discipline, and social responsibility.

Collaborations and Growth

To enhance academic exposure and research opportunities, the college has established collaborations with reputed national and international institutions, including universities and research organizations. These partnerships support innovation, skill development, and academic advancement.

Introduction

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 (hereafter referred to as NEP or Policy) recognizes that higher education plays an extremely important role in promoting human as well as societal well-being and in developing India as envisioned in its Constitution - a democratic, just, socially conscious, cultured, and humane nation upholding liberty, equality, fraternity, and justice for all. It notes that “given the 21st-century requirements, quality higher education must aim to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals”.

In accordance with the NEP 2020, the UGC has formulated a new student-centric “Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (CCFUP)” incorporating a flexible choice-based credit system, multidisciplinary approach, and multiple entry and exit options. This will facilitate students to pursue their career path by choosing the subject/field of their interest.

Transformative Initiatives that have a Bearing on the Undergraduate Education

The NEP envisages several transformative initiatives in higher education. These include:

- Introducing holistic and multidisciplinary undergraduate education that would help develop all capacities of human beings - intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, ethical, and moral - in an integrated manner; soft skills, such as complex problem solving, critical thinking, creative thinking, communication skills; and rigorous specialization in a chosen field (s) of learning.
- Adoption of flexible curricular structures in order to enable creative combinations of disciplinary areas for study in multidisciplinary contexts that would also allow flexibility in course options that would be on offer to students, in addition to rigorous specialization in a subject or subjects.
- Undergraduate degree programmes of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications such as:
 - a UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study,
 - a UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study,
 - a bachelor's degree after a 3-year (6 semesters) programme of study,
 - a 4-year bachelor's degree (honours) after eight semesters programme of study if the students complete
 - a rigorous research project in their major area(s) of study in the 4th year of a bachelor's degree (honours with research).
- The 4-year bachelor's degree programme is considered a preferred option since it would provide the opportunity to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education in addition to a focus on the chosen major and minors as per the choices of the student.
- Inclusion of credit-based courses and projects in the areas of community engagement and service, environmental education, and value-based education.
- Environment education to include areas such as climate change, pollution, waste management, sanitation, conservation of biological diversity, management of biological resources and biodiversity, forest and wildlife conservation, and sustainable development and living.
- Value-based education to include the development of humanistic, ethical, constitutional, and universal human values of truth, righteous conduct, peace, love, non-violence, scientific temper, citizenship values, and life skills.
- Lessons in service and participation in community service programmes to be an integral part of holistic education.



Main features of the New Curriculum Framework

The new curriculum framework will have the following features:

- I. Flexibility to move from one discipline of study to another;
- II. Opportunity for learners to choose the courses of their interest in all disciplines;
- III. Facilitating multiple entry and exit options with UG certificate/UG diploma/or degree depending upon the number of credits secured;
- IV. Flexibility for learners to move from one institution to another to enable them to have multi and/or interdisciplinary learning;
- V. Flexibility to switch to alternative modes of learning (offline, ODL, and Online learning, and hybrid modes of
- VI. Regulations for Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) and guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit are already in place to facilitate the implementation of the proposed “Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes”.

VII. Major and Minor disciplines

Major discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through core the major discipline.

Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline. For example, if a student pursuing an Economics major obtains a minimum of 12 credits from a bunch of courses in Statistics, then the student will be awarded B.A. degree in Economics with a Minor in Statistics.

Definitions, Eligibility and Duration of the Programme

Semester/Credits:

- A semester comprises 90 working days and an academic year is divided into two semesters.
- The winter vacation comprises five weeks. Internship/apprenticeship/work-based vocational education and training can be carried out during the winter vacation, especially by students who wish to exit after two semesters or four semesters of study. The HEIs can decide on the courses to be offered in the winter vacation depending on the availability of faculty and the number of students.

Awarding UG Certificate, UG Diploma, and Degree

UG Certificate: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 44 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

UG Diploma: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 86 credits will be awarded the UG diploma. These students are allowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.

3-year UG Degree: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 128 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement.

4-year UG Degree (Honours): A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with 168 credits.

4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research): Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline.

1. The prescribed credit weightage includes Lecture, Tutorial, and Practical components.
2. In the first semester, students will be offered three different subjects of the same stream: A, B, and C.
3. At the end of the second semester, each student may choose any one of two programs: Multi-Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary Programme or Single Major Programme. The students choosing the Single Major Programme will be required to give his/her Major and Minor at the end of second semester. Such choices made at the end of the second semester shall continue until the sixth semester.
4. Another discipline's DSC of the first two semester of those students who opt for a Major Programme will be treated as Minors.
5. A DSC offered in one discipline will be treated as a Minor by another. The students can choose Minor Courses from two different subjects but will have to earn a minimum of 12 credits in each.
6. MDCs must be selected from a broad discipline/pool of MDCs other than Major and Minor subjects and must not have been studied that course at the 12th level.
7. AEC/VAC/SEC-3 should be chosen from a pool of courses. Every discipline shall provide these courses, some of which will be offered discipline-specific while the rest can be open to students of all other disciplines. However, the two SECs (SEC-1 and SEC-2) must be chosen from discipline-specific (Core and Minor).
8. A maximum of two language courses can be opted as Core and Minor. AECs should be of a language other than those studied in DSCs/ Minors.
9. I/A/P/C activities will be determined at the end of the first semester, enabling students to carry out these activities during winter vacation.
10. To pursue a 4-year Honours degree, a student must study one discipline in which s/he has studied at least 11 Core courses (6 DSC + 5 DSE) in the first three years.
11. A student who secures 75% or more marks in aggregate till Semester 6 (up to 3-year degree) shall be eligible for a 4-year degree (Honours with Research), provided HPU has approved the college to offer it.
12. One course per semester (DSC/Minor/MDC/SEC/etc.) from a subject offered in two (or more) different programs (e.g., BCA and BSc/BPA and BA/BFA and BA/Shastri and BA) must be the same.
13. The students of the BA Programme can opt for only one DSC each from the Bachelor of Performing Arts (Dance/Music/Vocal & Instrument/Tabla, etc.) and Bachelor of Fine Arts (Painting/Applied Arts/Sculpture, etc.)
14. To pursue an Honours degree in the 4th year, students must choose only one discipline in both semesters of the 4th year, in which they have studied Five DSEs in the first three years.
15. Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfillment of the following conditions:
 - (a) **Major: 64/84 credits (3/4 years) in one subject/discipline**
 - (b) **Minor: 28 credits (4 years) in one subject/discipline**

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

1. **B.A. Pass Course:** Provided that the student who has passed +2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto, accepted as equivalent by various bodies of H.P. University with 33% marks (including English). The students opting for Mathematics as one of the subjects of study must have 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level. However, a student who has passed qualifying examination in Arts stream will be given preference in B.A. programme.
2. **B.Sc. Pass Course:** Provided that the student who has passed +2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto, accepted as equivalent by various bodies of H.P. University with pass marks in five subjects (three Science subjects, English & one optional) with 45% marks. The students seeking admission in B.Sc. 1st year (Non- Medical) have the option to choose either Chemistry or Computer Science as one of the Discipline Specific Courses for study.
3. **B.Com. Pass Course:** The minimum eligibility condition for a student to get admission in B.Com. is 33% marks at +2 level. However, a student who has passed the qualifying examination in Commerce stream will be given preference in the Commerce programme. The candidates opting for Commerce from other streams must have passed Mathematics/Economics as compulsory subjects at +2 level with a minimum of 45% marks in respective subject/s and 40% in aggregate.
4. A student who has passed Shastri, Prak Shastri from a Sanskrit College affiliated to H.P. University or Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University) under MHRD, Govt. of India, shall be eligible for admission to Arts stream only, provided the candidate has passed Prak Shastri or Shastri with English as one of the subjects.
5. Vocational subjects under National Vocational Education Qualification Framework (NVEQF) shall be given weightage equivalent to any other general education subject.
6. All the admissions in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. programme will be made on the merit of +2 examination, taking into consideration the best five subjects including English as one of the subjects.
7. **The students placed under compartment or failed in +2 examination are not eligible for admission to the college.**
8. Admission against quota meant for outstanding students in sports and cultural activities, shall be made only once in the beginning of the session. These students must also qualify the minimum eligibility conditions for admission in that course as provided under rules.
9. Only those students will be considered for Sports quota who have participated in international/ National/ State/ District Level Tournaments (or secured positions).
10. Only those students who have participated in cultural events at National/State/District Level will be considered for the quota meant for outstanding students in cultural activities.
11. It will be mandatory for the students admitted against Sports and Cultural quotas to participate in sports/cultural events.

Age Criteria (Upper Age Limit)

- An applicant must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years in case of girl students) as on July 1, 2026. A relaxation of 3 years is applicable to candidates belonging to SC/ST category.
- The Vice-Chancellor, HPU may, in exceptional cases/circumstances, to be recorded in writing, give relaxation in age up to a maximum of 6 months to any candidate. All such cases of age relaxation of up to six months may be granted admission provisionally by the Principal and a consolidated list of all such cases will be sent for approval to the Vice-Chancellor by 31st October of every academic year.
- Relaxation in upper age limit is admissible to physically challenged candidates also.

ADMISSIONS AND COURSE GUIDELINES- B.A./B.Sc./B.Com II & III YEAR

- Admission to the above classes is open on Roll- on basis. In Roll-on system, the students who have studied in I and II year in the previous session are allowed to take provisional admission in the next class i.e. in II and III year respectively, without waiting for the final result of the previous year.
- However, these students will have to fulfill all the formalities laid down by the college authorities like filling up of the online admission form and depositing the prescribed fee within the stipulated date and time. Admission schedule as notified by H.P. University will be displayed on the notice board and official website of the college.
- DSC-1 and DSC-II subjects, once chosen/allotted in B.A. I and B.Sc. I year cannot be changed in II or III year of B.A./ B.Sc.
- The students getting admission in II year will have to study two Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC-1 & SEC-2) in the DSC-1 or DSC- 2 subjects/disciplines of their choice studied in first year, in addition to the courses DSC-1,
- DSC-2, Compulsory English/MIL in B.A./B.Com. and DSC-1, DSC-2, DSC-3 in B.Sc.
SEC/ AEEC in II and III years will be from DSC-1 or DSC-2 subject allotted in first year.
- The students seeking admission in B.A./B.Com. III year will study the Discipline Specific Elective (DSE-1, DSE-2) courses in the subjects/disciplines studied earlier, SEC-3 and SEC-4 in the subject of their first choice studied and two courses of Generic Elective (GE-1 & GE-2) in an unrelated subject/discipline.
- The students in B.Sc. III year will have to study the DSE-1, DSE-2, DSE-3 courses in the subjects/disciplines selected earlier and SEC-3, SEC-4 in the subject of their first choice studied.
- Generic subject in B.A. III year will be any subject other than the DSC-1 and DSC-2 (Generic subjects will be allotted by the college).

Note: A candidate who fails to fill the online admission form and deposit the prescribed fee within stipulated period in Roll-on System will not be allowed to attend the classes and appear in annual examinations.

All the candidates are directed to strictly adhere to the timeline prescribed by the H. P. University.

- A candidate has to earn 132 credits for pass course degree in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. programme.
- An undergraduate degree in Humanities/Social Sciences/Commerce disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 Core papers each in two disciplines of choice, 2 Core papers each in English and MIL respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective based on 2 disciplines of choice selected above, respectively and 2 papers from the list of Generic Elective papers (See Table 1).
- An undergraduate degree in Science discipline may be awarded if a student completes 4 (DSC) Core papers each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses each in three discipline of choice (See Table 2).
- Every student shall be required to undergo a regular course of study i.e., attendance in lectures, tutorials, seminars, practical etc., in order to be eligible to appear for University examination. A candidate should attain 75% attendance in each of the concerned courses in Theory and Practical, separately.
- Internal Assessment/Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and Annual Examination will be as per HPU guidelines.
- In Annual System the minimum qualifying marks is 40% in aggregate. However, to score 35% marks in each CCA and Final Examination (separately) will be compulsory. For practicals, 40% passing marks will be mandatory.
- A candidate failing either in one or two subjects/papers in annual examination will be placed under compartment in those subjects/papers. Such students will have only two chances, one at supplementary stage and another at the annual stage, to clear the compartment.
- A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as FAIL, in that year and will have to repeat the entire year.
- The results will be declared as per grading system and the students will have to complete the degree within 5 years.

Note: The above guidelines/conditions may vary as per the latest notification by the H.P. **University**.

EVALUATION SYSTEM

As per H.P. University guidelines, the marks scheme for all undergraduate courses in annual system for B.A./B.Com programme will be in the ratio of 70:30 i.e., 70 marks for theory (annual examination) and 30 marks for Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)/Internal Assessment (IA). For all the courses of B.Sc. programme, the ratio will be 50:20:30 i.e., 50 marks for theory (annual examination), 20 marks for practical (annual examination) and 30 marks for CCA/IA respectively.

The 30% marks of CCA will be determined by the concerned teacher on the basis of the following components:

1. House Test=10 marks
2. Term Test/Class Test=5 marks
3. Assignments/Seminars=10 marks
4. Class Room Attendance=5 marks

Class room attendance will be defined as follows:

>75% but	<80%=1 mark.
>80% but	<85%=2marks
>85% but	<90%=3 marks
>90% but	<95%=4 marks
>95%=5 marks	

Note: Term tests will be conducted by the teacher on the completion of 40% of the syllabi and House Test on the completion of 75% of the syllabi.

Note: As per the University guidelines, the student who does not score 35% marks in CCA and fails to have minimum 75% class room attendance will not be allowed to appear in the annual examination.

Fines and Penalties

- A student who fails to deposit her dues within the stipulated dates shall have her name removed from the College rolls at the end of the month.
- The name of a student shall also be struck off if she remains absent without sanctioned leave for ten or more consecutive lectures.
- For re-admission, the student must be accompanied by her parent or guardian.
- After her name has been struck off, the student is required to apply for re-admission within seven days.
- A student wishing to withdraw from the College must obtain a No-Dues Certificate from all concerned authorities, including the College Office, Library, respective Department, NSS, Sports Section, Canteen, and Fee Office.

Note: The library security deposit made at the time of admission shall stand forfeited if a claim for refund is not submitted within one year of leaving the College.

LIBRARY

RAJKIYA KANYA MAHAVIDYALAYA, SHIMLA

The institution has a fully automated library, equipped with internet facilities, catering to the academic needs of students through its two-fold services—reading room and book circulation. The library operates from 8:30 AM to 7:30 PM on all working days.

Automation is enabled through **SOUL 3.0 (ILMS)**, which ensures efficient management of cataloguing, circulation, and easy access to library resources. The library is also supported by a **Visitor Management System (VMS)** to digitally monitor and manage visitor entry, ensuring safety and transparency.

The library maintains a rich collection of textbooks, reference books, and regularly subscribes to about 10 daily newspapers, 22 magazines, and 06 specialized journals. In addition, the library provides access to four e-newspapers, enabling users to stay updated with current national and international developments in a digital format.

Students are encouraged to make full use of the library facilities during working hours. Furthermore, the library's association with the **ONOS (One Nation One Subscription)** initiative provides access to over 13,000 e-journals of national and international repute, ensuring seamless access to a wide range of academic resources.

The library also offers a 30-day internship programme for students of B.Lib. and M.Lib., providing practical exposure to modern library management systems.



1. Every student must carry the Library-cum-Identity Smart Card while visiting the library.
2. Books are issued for a maximum period of 14 days. A fine of Rs. 1/- per day will be charged for late returns.
3. No book will be reissued to the same student immediately after its return.
4. Loss of a book must be reported immediately. The borrower will be required to replace the book or pay its cost.
5. In case a book is defaced or damaged, it must be replaced by the borrower

IDENTITY CARDS

1. A student without a valid **identity cum-library smart card** will be treated as an outsider.
2. Students will not be allowed to enter the college premises without their identity card.
3. The identity cum-library smart card will be issued by the Librarian.
4. In case of loss, a duplicate card will be issued only with the permission of the Principal.

LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS

1. Request for leave, duly signed by parent or guardian on the prescribed application form (available in the college office) shall be entertained.
2. Leave of any kind does not exempt the student from depositing fees/fines on the scheduled date. Similarly, the student has to return the borrowed books on the due date.
3. Dean of the concerned faculty can sanction leave up to 10 days, while leave for more than 10 days will be sanctioned by the Principal.
4. Leave on account of illness, for more than 10 days, must be accompanied by a Medical Certificate/ Registration slip.
5. Students representing college in any activity/event will have to get their leave sanctioned from the Dean and get it noted (to the concerned subject teachers) before their departure.
6. Once leave is sanctioned a student is required to inform the concerned teacher.
7. Leave of any kind will not be permitted during the Mid Term examinations except for leave under unavoidable circumstances.

SPORTS

The college has facilities and offers coaching to players for participation in Inter-College and Inter-University Sports Championships; Basket Ball, Volley Ball, Badminton, Cricket, Kho-Kho, Athletics, Cross Country, Chess, Handball, Hockey etc. The college has a well-equipped fitness center to ensure physical fitness and stress free life.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The college bring out a yearly issue of its magazine "Padam" with unfailing regularity, publishing works of students, having a flair for writing.



About the Course

The Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) is a 3-year, skill-based undergraduate programme (divided into 6 semesters) recognized at par with other bachelor programs like BA, B.Sc, and B.Com. B.Voc. lays emphasis on developing practical skills alongside academic learning. This program goes beyond classroom teaching, as it grooms students in professional skills, and provides exposure of industry through guest lectures and real-world insights from Industry Visits and Internships/ On the Job Training.

With 40% theory and 60% practical exposure, the course prepares students for immediate employment, facilitating their easy absorption in the industry and also empowering them for self-employment.

The college offers two NSQF-approved, UGC-recognized degree programs:

- B.Voc. in Retail Management – 40 Seats
- B.Voc. in Hospitality & Tourism – 40 Seats

Both programs offer assistance in campus placement with an average salary package ranging from ₹ 15,000-₹35,000.

ADMISSIONS

The eligibility criteria for admission shall be as per the University guidelines, issued from time to time. A maximum of 40 students can be admitted to B.Voc. programme in the first semester. No student shall be admitted directly to third or fifth semester.

Eligibility Conditions

- The candidate must have completed 10+2 (from HP board, CBSE, ICSE board, or any equivalent board) in any stream. Equal weightage will be given to students with vocational subjects at +2 level.
- There is no age bar for admission to this course.
- **The candidates who have acquired Vocational Certificate/Diploma or Advanced Diploma from UGC recognized Community Colleges/B.Voc institutions or DDU Kaushal Kendras in a specific sector with certified skills on a particular job role will be eligible for admission through lateral entry to next higher level on same sector.**
- Candidates with the following qualification can be given admission to the first semester of skill-based courses under NSQF

Category 1: Students who have already acquired NSQF certification level 4 in a particular industry sector may opt for admission in the skill-based courses under NSQF.

Category 2: Students who have acquired NSQF certification level 4 and would like to change their trade, may enter into skill based courses in a different trade.

Category 3: Students who have passed 10+2 examinations in conventional schooling without any background of vocational training.

NOTE: Preferred subjects and index mark calculations will be decided by the respective Board of Studies.

RESERVATION OF SEATS

The reservation of seats shall be as per Himachal Pradesh Government Notification issued from time to time and as per the rules of the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla.



- A candidate cannot pursue two full time Under-Graduate courses simultaneously.
- University reserves the right to cancel an admission at any stage.
- The applicants seeking re-entry into the education and training for further advanced learning in their field of expertise in a particular trade shall get preference in admission over the new applicants.
- In case of any matter relating to the Under-Graduate admissions, the decision of the Admission Committee/Vice-Chancellor of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla shall be final.

NOTE: All legal matters pertaining to the Under-Graduate admissions shall be subject to the Himachal Pradesh Jurisdiction only.

The college offers hostel facilities for 200 students in Tribal and Sainik Hostels. The admission to the hostel is strictly based on merit, subject to the prescribed reservation/weightage policy. The vacant seats are allotted to new students every year and preference is given to first year students.

Eligibility Conditions

- Only those students will be eligible to seek admission to the hostels who have sought admission to the college before the admission date is over (without late fee).
- Seats in Tribal Hostel are reserved for tribal students only. Students from other categories are admitted in the Sainik Hostel. Seats are also reserved for SC, OBC, IRDP, physically challenged, wards of army personnel, ex-servicemen, outstanding sportspersons, students who have excelled in cultural activities and also for foreign students as per the rules of H.P. Govt.
- Admissions to the hostels are subject to approval of the hostel administration, on merit basis, subject to production of requisite documents and proof of identification.

Procedure for Hostel Admission

1. The students seeking admission are required to submit the Hostel Admission Form online on this website link: <https://rkmvshimla.edu.in/studentcorner/hosteladmission/>
2. **Hard copy with requisite documents is to be submitted, on the dates notified by the college authority.**
3. The submitted forms are scrutinized by the Hostel Management Committee and the list of eligible students is displayed on the notice board and the college website.
4. At the beginning of the session, all the vacant seats in the hostel will be allotted to the students on the basis of their merit and their respective category.
5. In case any seat falls vacant, it is allotted to the next student in the merit list prepared at the beginning of the session.
6. The student who seeks admission to the hostels is expected to participate in college activities.

Documents/Certificates/Undertakings required for Admission

The following certificates issued by the competent authority are required for admission to the hostel:

1. A medical fitness certificate issued by a Govt. medical officer or recognized hospital/clinic.
2. SC/ST (if applicable) certificate issued by a first class magistrate.
3. Handicapped certificate issued by the CMO (mentioning the percentage of disability)
4. National/State/District level participation/position certificate (sports or cultural) issued by a competent authority.
5. Widows and daughters of military personnel, killed in action, should produce Free Education Entitlement Card from the Ministry of Defence. Daughters of military personnel /ex- servicemen should produce Free Education Entitlement Card from a competent Military Authority.



6. An Undertaking by Parents, mentioning that her ward does not suffer from any physical or mental illness. If she develops any physical or mental illness/abnormality during her stay in the college hostel, which may cause hindrance in the daily routine of co-boarders, the college authorities reserve the right to cancel her room allotment in the hostel.
7. An undertaking by the parent mentioning that her ward will not indulge in any act that comes under the category of ragging.
8. Information regarding local guardian must be provided on a separate form along with a passport size photograph of the guardian, his/her specimen signature, duly verified by the

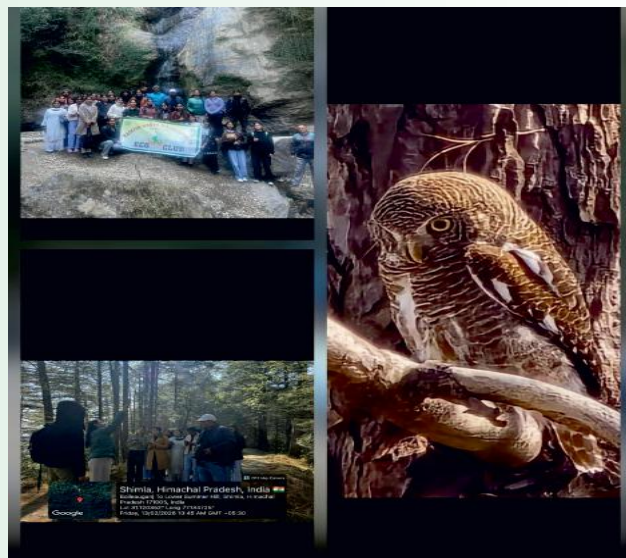
ROAD SAFETY CLUB

MICROBIOLOGY AND BIOTECHNOLOGY The Department of Microbiology and Biotechnology at RKMV was established in 2012. Equipped with good laboratory facilities, students have the opportunity to engage in hands-on experimentation and explore the intricate world of Microbiology and Biotechnology.

LANGUAGE LAB is equipped with 34 computers help to acquire proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing languages . The digital language lab offers a strong platform to the students for honing their skills and competency in English, Hindi and Sanskrit, in an interactive manner.

HOME SCIENCE LABORATORY The Home Science laboratory is well-equipped with modern facilities and appliances to support practical sessions and demonstrations. It provides students with hands-on experience in culinary arts and nutrition-related experiments. Further, the Apparel and Designing Laboratory is well furnished with essential tools and equipment to allow students to explore various aspects of apparel designing, pattern making, and garment construction.

ROTI BANK
