Brief Report on Communication of Student Assessment Results

Objective: To outline the methods and best practices for effectively communicating student assessment results through WhatsApp groups, notice boards, and classroom display of answer scripts.

1. WhatsApp. Group Communication

3. Classroom Display of Answer Scripts

• **Purpose**: Allow students to review their answer scripts in a controlled and private manner.

• Method:

- o Distribute scripts individually or allow students to collect them at the front.
- o Provide time for students to review their work quietly and ask questions.
- o **Example**: "Your answer scripts are available for review. Please come up to collect yours. I'll be available to clarify any doubts afterward."

• Best Practices:

- o Maintain privacy by allowing each student to review their own work.
- Conduct a group review or general feedback session to discuss common errors and learning points after the individual review.


 Schedule individual consultations if students need more time to discuss their performance.

Key Principles Across All Methods:


- **Confidentiality**: Ensure that individual student results are communicated privately, whether through WhatsApp messages or during classroom interactions.
